



Instructions for the Preparation of Full Papers

Authors are kindly requested to follow these instructions for the preparation of full papers for publication on CD-ROM for the **EUROCORR 2010 conference**. A full paper is welcome for every accepted **ORAL** or **POSTER** presentation. Good English is essential. The papers will not undergo a refereeing process.

➔ **1. Deadline for submission: 15 July 2010**

Papers which are not submitted until that date cannot be considered for the CD ROM.

➔ **2. Submission: please submit your paper online at**

➔ **3. Format: "camera-ready" pdf-file**

Please make sure that any special Word symbols are correctly rendered in the pdf-file and do not add any file protection.

Please note: enter the paper title and author's name as document information.

➔ **4. Length: no page limit**

➔ **5. Size of the file: 1 MB**

➔ **6. Page set-up:**

A4 paper format (210 x 297 mm). Top, Left- and right-hand margins: 2.5 cm, bottom margin 2 cm. Page number centred at the bottom. Line spacing of the text should be 14,4 pt and justified, using Times New Roman or Arial 12pt normal font if not otherwise stated.

Title, names and affiliations: The title should be centred in bold 14pt letters, followed by the name(s) of the author(s) (centred, 12 pt), and affiliations *i.e.* postal and e-mail addresses (centred, italics, 12 pt). The name of the presenting author should be underlined. Please leave a line between the title and the authors/affiliations, and two lines between the authors/affiliations and the body of the text.

The paper should start with a Summary followed by conventional sections such as Introduction, Experimental Setup, Results, Discussion, Conclusions and Outlook. Please type headers in bold letters with the text beginning on the next line.

Tables and Figures

Tables (caption directly above) and Figures (caption directly below) should be integrated into the text, but separated by one blank line above and below. Captions must be numbered and typed in 12pt italics. The characters within figures have to be large enough to be easily read.

References

References have to be numbered in square brackets (e.g. [1]), in the order of appearance in the text. The list of references should be left-aligned and placed at the end of the text.
